


Name	Garlic Mustard <i>Alliaria petiolata</i> Regulated weed	Fringe Cups <i>Tellima grandiflora</i> native plant	Large-Leaf Avens <i>Geum macrophyllum</i> native plant	Piggyback Plant <i>Tolmiea menziesii</i> native plant	Stinging Nettle <i>Urtica gracilis</i> native plant
Leaf, Height, & Habit	<p>Garlic Mustard <i>Alliaria petiolata</i> Regulated weed</p>  <p>kidney to triangle, wavy edges 1-3 ft tall, upright</p>	<p>Fringe Cups <i>Tellima grandiflora</i> native plant</p>  <p>fuzzy, round/heart, palmate, toothed edges 1-3 ft tall, upright, spreading</p>	<p>Large-Leaf Avens <i>Geum macrophyllum</i> native plant</p>  <p>rough, toothed, compound leaflet pairs, large end leaf, top leaves 3 deep lobes, 1-2 ft tall, upright, spreading</p>	<p>Piggyback Plant <i>Tolmiea menziesii</i> native plant</p>  <p>fuzzy, round/heart, 3-5 lobes, serrated 1-1.5 ft, spreading</p>	<p>Stinging Nettle <i>Urtica gracilis</i> native plant</p>  <p>heart to lance, hairy, sharply toothed 3-6 ft tall, upright</p>
Flower	 <p>tiny (< 1/5"), white, 4 petals</p>	 <p>spikes/stalks of tiny fringed greenish white (sometimes pink tinged) cup flowers</p>	 <p>yellow, 5 petals with large bristly center</p>	 <p>spikes/stalks of small tubular purplish/brown flowers</p>	 <p>greenish, hanging clusters</p>
Other	 <p>garlicky smell when crushed, narrow seed pod, "alternate" leaves on mature stem</p>	 <p>hairy stem, leaves/stems get reddish tinge in some conditions</p>	 <p>seeds resemble spiky balls, hairy stem</p>	 <p>small plantlets form at leaf bases, hairy stem</p>	 <p>leaves "opposite" along square stem, stinging hairs</p>

Leaf, Height, & Habit	<p>basal leaves rosette</p>  <p>upper leaves mature plant</p>  <p>kidney to triangle, wavy edges 1-3 ft tall, upright</p>	<p>rosette</p>  <p>mature</p>  <p>heart, hairy, serrated 3-5 ft tall, upright</p>	<p>basal leaves rosette</p>  <p>upper leaves mature</p> <p>oval, hairy, toothed, lobe at leaf base 1-2 ft tall, upright</p>	 <p>kidney shaped, scalloped, small spreading groundcover</p>	 <p>round or heart, serrated or scalloped low growing</p>	 <p>palmate, folded, toothed 1-3 ft, spreading</p>
Flower	 <p>tiny (< 1/5"), white, 4 petals</p>	 <p>med. (3/4"), purple (sometimes white), 4 petal</p>	 <p>small (1/4-1/2"), yellow, ray</p>	 <p>purple whorls, bilateral, funnel shaped flowers</p>	 <p>various colors & sizes, 5 petal</p>	 <p>pink/purple, size varies, 5 notched petals</p>
Other	 <p>garlicy smell when crushed, narrow seed pod, "alternate" leaves on mature stem</p>	 <p>round/flat seed pods, hairy stems</p>	 <p>mature stems branch towards top</p>	 <p>square stem, minty smell when crushed, leaves are "opposite" on stem</p>	 <p>bottom petal forward/distinct</p>	 <p>some species crawl, others grow upright, hairy stems</p>
