

FOXTAIL GRASS KILLS

Foxtails can become embedded in your pet's paws, ears, eyes, and nose. They can be inhaled and puncture a lung, or migrate to the brain. **These injuries can be fatal.**

Foxtails can dig into any part of the body and they do not dissolve. Pets with long fur are especially vulnerable. Foxtails have barbed needles and do not come out on their own!

If your pet has been exposed, inspect their coat, paws, ears, eyes, nose, and privates. Check their underbelly and under their collar, inside their mouth and around their lips.

Foxtail symptoms include continuous sneezing, pawing at or licking an infected area, violent shaking of the head, frequent head tilting, sores or abscesses, swelling, discharge, coughing, and limping.

Avoid exposing your pet, and **help us remove foxtails from our neighborhood!**
